

## **Fabulous Fun with Fabric Paints Class - Jeanne Aird**

Create unique fabrics using paints in a variety of fun techniques. Learn how to make patterns and textures with stamps, stencils, shibori techniques and more.

**Materials Fee: \$30** Includes all paint and use of art equipment and other supplies

### **Supply List:**

Two yards of **pre-washed** white cotton fabric. When washing it, do not use softeners. The higher the thread count, the less paint will bleed. The smoother the finish of the fabric, the easier it will be to get smooth brush strokes. PFD (Prepared for Dyeing) cotton works great. Kona cotton works well too. Dharma Trading Company is an online resource for PFD fabric. Local shops may sell it as well. I will have extra on hand if you need to purchase more.

**Brushes:** A variety of inexpensive foam and chip brushes, ranging from ½ inch to 3 inches

**Apron, Nitrile or latex disposable gloves**

**Roll of paper towels**

**Cloth rags-** 2 or so

**Quart size container** for rinse water

**Water spray bottle**

**Scissors:** paper and fabric ones

**Paint Palette with divisions** or old muffin tin or styrofoam plates with sections

**Favorite foam or rubber stamps or found objects and stencils** that you can ink up or use to create rubbings. (I will be bringing lots of fun stuff to share, so only bring things **you may already have.**)

**4 to 6 inch in diameter cylinder** for Arashi Shibori - This could be a large coffee can, 28 oz. vegetable or sauce can, 2 litre bottle or length of PVC pipe (no longer than 2 ft.)

**Notebook with pen/pencil**

**Black Sharpie** or other brand permanent ink marker to label your fabrics

**Hair Dryer** (Only if you already have one, to help speed up drying time)
